Through joint efforts, the Dutch water sector has made itself heard in Parliament.
And we will do so again in the coming period, as a new government takes shape.

Water is not a standalone issue.

It is a foundation for food security, climate resilience, energy systems, public health and economic stability and trade.

There is great risk in fragmentation.

And collective action could be our greatest strength.

At NWP, our members are at the heart of everything we do.

Not as a slogan, but as a working principle.

Our members represent the full diversity of the water sector — public and private, large and small, established leaders and young professionals.

They are our eyes and ears, both in the Netherlands and internationally.

NWP does not replace that diversity.

We connect it.

Our role is to bring people together, to create focus where needed, and to help translate expertise into a shared action.

Creating alignment without uniformity.

And momentum without central control.

We will also introduce a **new membership category** this year, to better connect the knowledge and networks of the many freelance experts in our sector.

Our direction remains clear:

Partnerships for a water-driven future.

Water does not exist in isolation.

It intersects with agriculture, energy, nature, urban development and industry.

Over the past two years, we have deliberately strengthened partnerships beyond our own sector.

And at the end of December, we formalised a new collaboration with **Dutch Greenhouse Delta**.

This is not symbolic.

It reflects a strategic choice: to position water – not just where it is traditionally discussed – but where it creates leverage.

And this year, we will further invest in thematic and cross-sectoral approach – not to talk more, but to connect better.

In today's context, **alignment between sector and government** does not happen by itself.

That is why NWP has taken on the role to connect the expertise and ambitions of the sector with public institutions in a more focused and strategic way.

Not to speak for the sector,
but to help the sector speak with greater clarity and consistency.

This is not about uniformity.

It is about coherence.

And coherence is what gives us all credibility — and impact — on the global stage.

As many of you might know.. On 1 January, we started YEP Phase 3 — together with NFP & MoFA.

seven new years of investing in young professionals, with a strong focus on Water and Agro, and on the active and growing alumni network.

Because the future of our sector is not only about policy frameworks or technologies — it is about people, continuity and leadership.

And our platforms also remain central in bringing people together.

And throughout the year, we will continue to coordinate missions, lead Dutch pavilions at international events, and keep you and the international community connected through our channels.

There is much ahead — more than I can cover here.

So stay connected, follow our work, and know that you are always welcome at our office.

Let me return to where I began.

The snow reminded us that meaningful change does not always start with a grand plan. Sometimes it starts with a small interaction. A shared moment. A willingness to act together.
