Featured: Jan 26 | Building a Climate-Resilient Maryland Together | USA

Join us on January 26 for the 'Building a climate-resilient Maryland together' knowledge symposium for a joint exploration on the topic of climate resilience in Maryland and in the Netherlands. The event plenary will focus on strategies for coastal areas, cities, and small communities. The symposium will also include digital breakout sessions to discuss with fellow public and private sector actors in Maryland about nature-based solutions, citizen engagement, private-public partnerships, resilience in ports, resilient rural communities, and the collaboration of Rijkswaterstaat with the US Army Corps of Engineers on the topic Engineering with Nature.
